The Field Director (FD) is an essential part of the executive team of the campaign, and will work in tandem with the Field Data Director. The primary responsibility of the FD is to hire, train and manage Regional Field Directors (RFDs). The FD will also monitor and track progress to numerical goals on a daily, weekly and month basis, and prepare weekly reports in direct response to progress towards those goals. In addition, the FD will work closely with the Data Director to develop and execute the field organizing plan, as well as to plan and execute a variety of virtual fundraising and field events.

Other responsibilities include but are not limited to: Identifying, winning, and mobilizing support from community leaders and organizations; representing the campaign at virtual community events and meetings; interviewing and training potential new field staffers; and plan and execute large trainings and events, such as phone-banks, text banks, and other virtual outreach and programming.

Qualifications/Requirements:

- Excellent interpersonal skills, organization and attention to detail
- Experience working with diverse populations and coalitions
- Ideal candidate will have a working knowledge of the structure of political campaigns and familiarity with campaign technology, including but not limited to VAN, NGP, Google Suite, and Google Docs and Sheets.
- Demonstrated experience working on electoral, union, or community organizing campaigns in battleground states/districts

- Ability to take feedback and implement changes in real time
- Access to personal vehicle, as well as required insurance.
